Contents: Hunter readily complies with Nichols's request that the wood cut of the 'hall in the Ponds' or the Laundry might be used in the 'Gentleman's Magazine'. The drawing was, as Nichols supposes, made by Mr Blore, whose drawings were used extensively in his 'History of Hallamshire'. He was planning to wait until May in hopes of entrusting the wood cut to a friend who was going to town, or to bring it himself, had he not also wished to return the proof of the review for the next 'Gentleman's Magazine'. He thanks Nichols for the very friendly notice he has taken of the volume, which cannot fail to produce a greater attention to the work than it has hitherto received.

Contents: Bowyer Nichols delayed the proof [of Hunter's 'South Yorkshire'] for a day or two till he could learn more about the prices of paper. 'Your Small Paper Hallamshire now lies before me. It is what Printers call Crown Paper; Paper of that size but of better quality, if wove paper, might be had for about 25/- a ream [500 sheets]. If you want Paper very stout inside, and consequently heavier, we must pay about 1/6 a lb for every pound heavier the ream weighs. I forget what size your Large Paper Copies are, but believe they are what the Printers call Royal. I suppose Royal Paper will cost from 50/- to 60/- a ream.'

'The Printing is usually charged by 250s, that is any number short of 250 is charged as 250, any number 250 and 500 as 500'. [sic]

'I can only give you a very rough idea of the cost of Printing till we see what proportion of large and small type matters bear to each other; but looking at the Hallamshire, I should think that Printing 500 copies of the Small Paper would be about 45/- a sheet, and 250 of the fine Paper, with margin altered, 14/- a sheet.'

Contents: Hunter fears that Bowyer Nichols will begin to think that he does nothing to deserve his kindness in sending him the 'Gentleman's Magazine'. What he now sends, which is the kind of communication which Nichols led him to think would be acceptable, may not perhaps be thought to harmonize sufficiently with the general tone of the work. He has Hunter's full consent to omit any passage he thinks fit. Or it might be inserted entire as copied from a provincial publication. He may do the same with the notices of the same very excellent person contained in the other paper which he sends him. He wishes the papers to be returned to him when done with. He encloses a letter from his friend, the Rev. Henry Crown, vicar of Buckingham, relating to a misrepresentation in Dr. Johnston's Parr which he is anxious to correct. Nichols did quite right in respect of the [D. of Lord's?] copy and his [Vox-Lanes?]. He is sure they would wish to have large paper.

Contents: Hunter returns the proofs[of 'South Yorkshire'] and sends a few more sheets of copy. He also encloses a few letters which he asks Bowyer Nichols to put in the 2d post and a letter from [McElisirs?] in reference to the enquiries about Mr Leman which he fears will contain little that is satisfactory. They seem wonderfully indifferent about the literary reputation of Mr Leman.
The note for Mr Baker may be sent in the next parcel and Hunter asks Nichols to transmit from his account to his credit three guineas which he has received from him at Bath. He hoped to have sent Nichols another remittance but the people in Yorkshire are rather tardy, or rather the book will be put in the Christmas account of many subscribers. There is a small sum due to him from Mr Baldwin of Paternoster Row, publisher of the now deceased 'Retrospective Review'. It is from 15 to 20 pounds.

He will take more notice of it when he sees the proofs of his little tract. He congratulates Nichols on his escape. It was prudent of them not to suffer the literary merits of the work to come into question. He has seen it in the library at Stourhead, a more evident catch-penny publication they have not in their own literature. If he had access to it, he would send Nichols a collection of proofs of the ignorance and incapacity of the publisher. If Nichols wishes to send him down a copy for the purpose he will prepare an article for the next 'Gentleman's Magazine' which would show the matter in its true light to the public and [end] any risk of exposing Nichols to another action of libel.

Hunter presented a copy to Mr Homfray with great pleasure because he had shown a willingness to assist him with information and to promote the circulation of the book when he was in better circumstances than he fears may now be the case. But he sees no reason for giving the books to the other gentleman and has been reluctant to write to him. He finds this the most disagreeable part of his labours.

He wrote on Tuesday to ask that a slip might be printed with some alterations in the Fitzwilliam pedigree.
